## HCUC update for April 21, 2024

Thanks to everyone who came out and supported Friday's concert with Alex Burnett & Friends. We had a full house and the energy was awesome.

In worship this month we focused on Earth Day themes. During our Wondering Time we thought about land. During our sermon, we focused on EarthDay.org's theme – 60 x 40 (reducing plastics by 60% by the year 2040). As we talked about it at church, it might be more challenging than imagined. Let's talk about it together and see what we can come up with. One idea was to bring in things that replace single-use plastics (a metal straw, for example) and have them on display. I will continue to wonder about all of this and how I can do it better too.

### **Church Council Meeting Summary:**

- Council offers our gracious thanks to everyone who has been contributing to the financial challenges that we've put out. The \$29 for Leap Year totals: \$555 and the \$40 for Lent (as of March 31): \$240. Your additional contributions are making a difference, so thank you.
- The Alex Burnett concert was a great event and we had a profit of about \$2,000.
- We have forms for new folks who wish to stay in touch with us and/or want to participate in the life of the church.
- Our website has a few updates the homepage is less wordy and more images are there. We now also have our own Google calendar so you can see everything that's going on (and yes, you can even see if the church is available on a date you're considering having an event.) We also added an "Events & Registration" page for those who want to register for our free events online. We will still have a registration sheet available at the church and you can always call in or email too. More changes will slowly be implemented, so keep checking our website and let the office know what you think.
- Grants we received one grant for a total of \$24,700. We were denied a local grant for a music idea. We submitted a grant for \$10,000 through Ontario for Seniors. We submitted a grant in February to Bell Let's Talk for \$20,000 for Mental Health supports. We will hear back in June about the Ontario grant and Bell Let's Talk grant. Please note that the funds from these grants can only be used for what we submitted in the application process (Seniors programs) and not to support our church budget and expenses. (The grants pay for the things that help us to offer programs for free.)
